Will your Lions Club vote for adventure? What if you reserve one of your meetings for hands-on service work—and fun? Then, ask each kid to write a chapter for a book; the kids can share their stories in school and deliver a special edition of their book to the retirement center. A shared experience is a wonderful family memory!
- ✓ Check with a day care center. Maybe the walls need painting, or cookies need baking, or stories need reading!
- ✓ Could your club partner with another service or civic club to tackle a larger project together? Partnerships are powerful!
- ✓ Ask school administrators what your club could do to help. Perhaps reading or tutoring? Or sprucing up classrooms? Or maintaining the baseball field?
- ✓ Could you help prepare or deliver Meals on Wheels?
- ✓ Ask your city council where you could help. Parks? Street cleanup? Library?
- ✓ Is there a physically challenged friend in your community who needs a little help painting or maintaining her home?
- ✓ Maybe the historical museum needs assistance.
- ✓ Perhaps your local food bank or county health department is just waiting for you to speak up.

Opportunities abound. Throw out a few of these ideas at your next meeting; your members will come up with even more imaginative ways to serve by giving your TIME.

So, stick your neck out and try something new! Let me know what happens, OK?

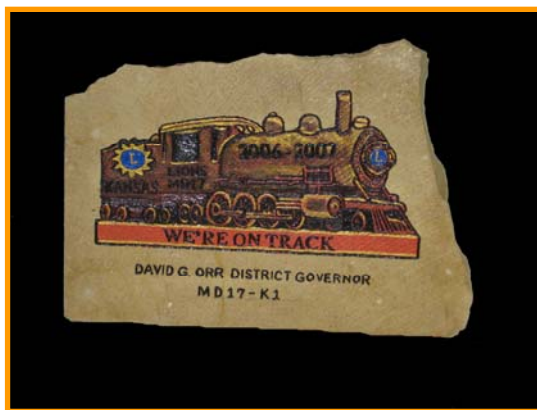

Try Pet Therapy!!! It's a great family activity too!

Here is what you need:

1. Cats or dogs that have had their vaccinations and are healthy. It could be the family pet if their temperament is good.
2. Cats or dogs who are people friendly and very mellow. We **CAN NOT** have any pets that have a history of biting or scratching people. To start we recommend using your own pets that you know well and are familiar with to take for pet therapy.
3. Nursing Homes, Assisted Living Facilities, and Hospitals, who are interested in having Pet Therapy for their patients/residents. Also people who live alone and are lonely.
4. Club members who like animals and people.
5. Leashes and/or pet carriers.
6. Water and food bowls and pet food.
7. Once you have located appropriate pets, contact the Activity Director of your local facilities and set a day for Pet Therapy. Your Club members who are interested in this project could offer this to area facilities and shut ins as often as you would like to do it. This can be a weekly event, if you and the facility so desire. Or, it could be a bimonthly or monthly activity. Even to offer it just a few times a year would be a help to the folks who love animals and do not have a pet.
8. This project should bring lots of pleasure to the animals and the people involved.

### LIONS RESERVE MINT CAR:

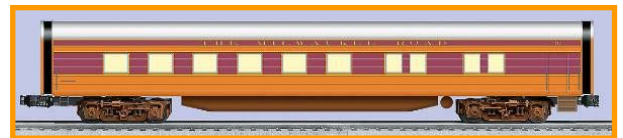
(Train Car Loaded with Gold Bricks)

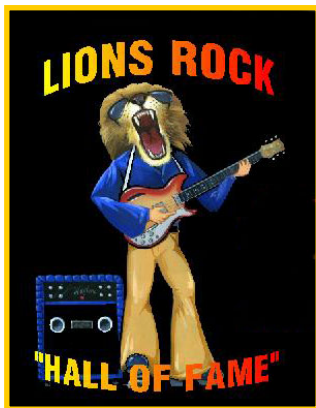
